

ANNETTE (ANN) (36)


Jameson's spunky partner and single mom to 8-year-old son Bobby. She can run with the best of them.

Nicknames her partner Jameson "Hollywood."




BRUCE (58)




SKY (40)






Practical Effects The Real Deal



ACT I

THE DRIVE-IN


Detective Jameson Renner—a jaded cop trades his acting dreams for a badge due to his father's objections. He attends a revolutionary 3D movie premiere at a drive-in theater, hosted by his estranged childhood friend and fellow cinephile, Bruce. Agreeing to babysit his partner's 8year-old son Bobby, Renner's quiet night of cinema becomes a waking nightmare when legendary horror icons—including the Masked Conductor (aka, Phantom of the Opera), the Werewolf (aka, Wolfman), and The Mummy-burst from the screen into terrifying reality.



ACT II

MONSTERS UNLEASHED

Renner reluctantly teams up with two spunky teenagers, Peter and Marie, to battle these flesh-and-blood monsters as they terrorize the City of Angels. The stakes soar when the Conductor becomes dangerously obsessed with Marie mistaken for his beloved Christine, the Werewolf leaves Peter fighting for his life, and the Midnight Muncher threatens Bobby and his mother Annette.



ACT III

THE SHOWDOWN

Their heart-pounding adventure races through iconic Hollywood landmarks—from the Hollywood **Bowl to Grauman's Egyptian Theatre** -where they must confront Bruce and his dangerous creation in a final showdown. Just when victory seems certain, a bone-chilling howl pierces Tinseltown's night sky, suggesting some nightmares never truly end.





IMAGINED MOVIE MOMENTS (IMMS)

With an absentee, alcoholic father, Jameson was raised by the movies, specifically the monsters from classic horror films. Jameson's deepest desire of becoming a Hollywood movie star manifests in both comedic and terrifying ways through his Imagined Movie Moments (IMMS).

Throughout the film, Jameson escapes into the magic of movies - literally transforming into characters from famous films and quoting memorable lines from unforgettable scenes.

IMMS occur seamlessly, embedded within the scene and in response to other character's dialogue or action on screen, so the audience does not leave the physical space.




The film's soundtrack is a steady stream of popular 1950's songs diegetically deejayed by Sky at Tinseltown Radio. From upeat rock & roll to melancholy doo-wop and celebratory show tunes, each song is intricately woven into the story's fabric capturing the mood and often playfully working in tandem with each scene.

Hollywood Horrors cinematic score will be thematic, thrilling, suspenseful, and dark while embodying the nostalgia of 1950s Hollywood and the magic and wonder of movies punctuating Jameson's emotional journey through his real-life movie adventure.




